Presentation of Bus 209 "Curfew" Proposal Request: Jim Jenkin

Request by ~ 50 concerned residents for a "Night Route" detour of the Bus 209 from the Avenues section of the Route. Bus would not enter Avenues in late evening and early evening (e.g. 9pm-6am).

Moves this topic be placed as an agenda item for a next available meeting.
Second by D. Alderman.

Motion amended to invite UTA to attend. Dave Alderman will invite.

Process: Discussion at one meeting and vote on the next.
Concerns expressed about broad consensus, specifically bus riders at that time.

D. Alderman reports that City sales tax revenue is going to support increased frequency on Routes across SLC, including this one. August Changes are to be reviewed today, and no Avenue Changes were planned. This will be an uphill battle.

Type of vehicle change has been recommended - long term only.
