At our meeting this month we will have a presentation regarding HB 48 Wildland Urban Interface fire code revisions, homeowner's insurance status and impact, and potential insurance legislation. SLC Fire Department personnel and Representative Jennifer Dailey-Provost, District 22, are invited. A Q&A session will follow. This is important information not only for those directly at the interface but for all of us. Insurance companies are scrutinizing risk more sharply than ever before as natural disasters increase. Rates are partially based on zip code and since we all share a zip code, rate increases and coverage limitations could impact us all.

On October 15, Capitol Hill, Fairpark, and The Greater Avenues Community Councils will host a Candidate Night with the Candidates for City Council District 3. This event will be at the Marmalade Library from 5:30-7:30pm. This will be a great opportunity for you to chat with all of the candidates in one visit and to hear from them as they address issues facing the entire district.

I hope that as you transition from the long less structured days of summer to the routine of Fall you will feel refreshed and ready for cooler weather, the changing beauty of the landscape and the opportunity to gather with friends and neighbors at our September Community Council Meeting. Batting for Bats By Hilary Jacobs

Imagine a mammal that flies like no other creature, who lives in almost every global ecosystem,

and whose appetite pollinates plants (nectar eaters) or controls agricultural pests (insectivores). This marvel of evolution is the bat. Eighteen species, all protected, roost in nooks and crannies throughout Utah, from high mountains to deserts. Nocturnal, insectivorous bats venture out at night to hunt, using complex echolocation to nab countless mosquitoes, beetles, moths, etc. During the day bats roost—hang by their back feet—to rest and conserve energy.

Bats' membranous wings are supported by elongated arm and hand bones providing dexterity that enables remarkably agile flight. If our hand to body proportions were like bats our middle finger would be about seven feet long! At dusk look for shadows flitting and diving around you. If you're lucky you'll see bats feasting while zigzagging across the night sky.

How Fire Codes and Insurance May Affect Your **Property** By Amy Merritt-Smith

Beginning January 1, 2026, Utah House Bill 48 mandates that about 1,700 Salt Lake City properties at the wildland urban interface (WUI) are subject to new building and property fire codes, which may also impact those property's future insurability.

The City is currently reviewing HB 48 mandated WUI fire codes for incorporation into existing building codes. You are invited to participate in this process at the link below. HB 48 will also rate and assign a tiered WUI property classification resulting in an annual fee. This legislation establishes that an owner may access resources to bring the property to the first or second classification by applying WUI building standards. The State will develop a database beginning on January 1, 2028, and accessible to WUI property and casualty insurers to learn WUIdesignated property classifications.

The September Community Meeting features two speakers covering HB 48 WUI fire code revisions, homeowner's insurance status and impact, and potential insurance legislation. SLC Fire Department personnel and our House Representative Jennifer Dailey-Provost, District 22, are invited. A Q&A session will follow their remarks. Environmental Tip for September by Jill Van Langeveld

- •Reduce Disposable Items: Summer activities often involve disposable products. Make it a habit to use reusable water bottles, containers, and utensils instead, keeping a set in your bag or car for easy access. Consider reusable snack bags for outings to minimize waste from single-use packaging.
- •Conserve Water Wisely: Watering your garden or lawn during the early morning or evening hours reduces water loss due to evaporation and ensures plants absorb more water. Consider using a rain barrel to collect rainwater for watering plants and gardens.
- •Choose Sustainable Travel Options: Opt for walking, biking, or public transportation for shorter trips to reduce reliance on cars and minimize greenhouse gas emissions. If you're traveling longer distances, consider taking a train instead of flying to reduce your carbon footprint.
- •Connect with Nature: Take advantage of the season to spend time outdoors, appreciating the natural environment and fostering a connection that motivates you to protect it.
































Community Kindness Program - Winner for September! by Jenn Beck
